The existing porch is already within the front yard setback area. There is no way to construct a front porch that is not within the setback, as the house extends to the setback.

The variance is not substantial, as screening the front porch will still have a 30' set back line. Being a screen enclosure, the feel of the property will remain much the same as currently.
